



SHINE! Prayer Journey – Encouraging Feedback Report – January 2026

Ann Low recently gathered feedback gathered from participants in the SHINE! prayer journey from the past four months that paints a deeply encouraging picture of what God is doing through children, families, and intergenerational prayer. Across continents and cultures, contributors consistently testified to renewed faith, clarity of vision, and a growing confidence in children as active partners in God's mission.

A dominant theme from Question 1 was the revelation that children can pray—and are eager to do so when given the opportunity. Lucy from Malaysia shared simply yet powerfully that “children can pray and they are willing to pray if we let them.” This conviction was echoed by Arslan from Pakistan, who observed increasing confidence in children and a clear sense that God is preparing them with His heart for nations and tribes. Fr Sherry from India affirmed that children are “instruments for God’s glory,” calling adults to intentionally encourage, guide, and create space for children to exercise their spiritual gifts.

Several contributors highlighted the power of unity and corporate prayer. Alison from Perth reflected on the significance of each individual’s participation in the Zoom gatherings, noting how young people were encouraged — some stepping out to lead — and how praying together for the nations strengthened faith and purpose. Sindi from Botswana pointed to Genesis 11:6, emphasising how unity releases spiritual momentum and breakthrough when God’s people move together with one heart.

Responses to Question 2 revealed how deeply impactful praying around the Light.of.the.World movie has been. Lucy described the film as “an answer to our prayers for a Godly digital platform,” enabling a whole new generation of the 2 Billion Children to encounter Jesus. Alison affirmed that these media resources are “powerful” and already having a global effect across generations. Fr Sherry shared that praying through this lens stirred a deeper burden for the unreached, moving prayer into compassionate action.

Beyond these questions, participants repeatedly expressed gratitude for experiencing the beauty of the global Church. Tabby (from The Salvation Poem) spoke of being inspired, encouraged, and humbled by the shared spiritual covering over Light.of.the.World, while others noted how hearing the faith and prayers of believers worldwide increased their own passion to reach the lost. Many voiced

strong support for continuing SHINE! into 2026, recognising it as a timely and Spirit-led movement to disciple children early and sustain momentum for prayer and mission.

Together, this feedback confirms that SHINE! is not only shaping children — it is transforming families, strengthening the global Church, and aligning generations with God's heart for the Harvest.
